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Course Description

Pre-Algebra is a pre-requisite course for Algebra 1. During the year we will be reviewing basic skills and covering using variables, replacing variables, geometry, graphing, data, statistics and probability, exponents, square roots and the Pythagorean Theorem.

Course Goals and Objectives

Course Materials

Materials will be provided in class. Students need to come prepared with a pencil and eraser. Calculators will be provided for use. We will use AGS Pre-Algebra as our primary resource, as well as some secondary resources, such as Mountain Math, the internet and other hard copy sources.

Format and Procedures

Students will have a daily warm up activity upon entering the classroom. There will also be a daily vocabulary word. They will then learn the daily objective and proceed with the lesson. They will see how problems are done, practice together as a group and then have a opportunity to master the concept on their own. Students' work will be checked on an ongoing basis to ensure understanding.

Course Requirements

Students are expected to:

- Be on time for class
- Be prepared, have a pencil and eraser
- Complete class work and individual work during class
- Participate
- Respect the environment and those in it

Grading Procedures

- Students will be graded on their academic performance as well as their citizenship.
- Daily class work, participation and chapter tests will count for the majority of their grade.
- Assignment values vary depending on the number of problems.
- Students will be allowed to make up assignments if there is an excused absence. Work needs to be completed by the end of the term.
- Grades will be given at mid-term and end of term.
- Extra credit is available each semester for all students.
- Parents will be notified at mid-term and end of term for failures. Parents can check their student's grade at any time on PowerSchool, using their student's ID number.
- Parents may contact me at any time to discuss their student's progress.
